Harper Garth Bus Shelter – we have successfully secured a grant from LCC that will enable the bus shelter to be repaired; work is expected to be completed by the summer.

**Village Pump –** we are delighted to have made a winning grant application to ELDC that will enable the brick walls to be raked out and repointed. This will not only improve the appearance of the pump but also protect the longevity of this unique village asset.
